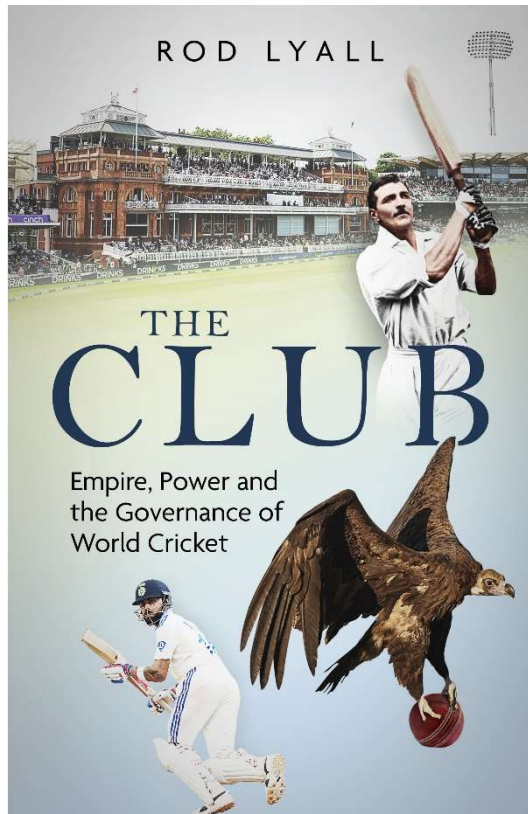

From its early days in St John's Wood, London, the Imperial Cricket Conference has morphed into the International Cricket Council (ICC), a multi-billion-dollar sporting business, based in Dubai and increasingly dominated by a financially and politically ambitious Indian elite. Having failed to deal effectively with such challenges as the Bodyline controversy, apartheid and Kerry Packer's commercialisation of the game, the ICC has become both the beneficiary and the victim of the resources that come from media rights deals and sponsorship of global events. But that wealth and India's power have brought with them new problems: match-fixing, administrative corruption, and the threat from franchise leagues, pioneered by the IPL, which increasingly endanger the international game.
